Principal's Message Greetings to the ATAC community.

As we are now in the middle of the first term. Most students have started working on their projects and their academic plans. ATAC has upgraded the internet connectivity and computers to assist students in their learning. All parents/guardians have been contacted for meetings to discuss the progress of their child. We have had several discussions in the last two weeks so that we can get early feedback. We are very thankful to parents who feel happy that their child feels engaged and loves to come to ATAC. We are emphasizing on the "Code of Expectations of Behavior" and self-discipline for getting the students job ready.

The growing interest in the Accelerated Careers Excellence Program (ACEP) enables students to complete most of their academic subjects by the mid of year 12 is attractive to some students. Students can start the apprenticeship program early if they have successfully completed the internal assessments. We are preparing them to

do apprenticeship for two to three days per week in the final year. Our simple and comprehensive

program is very suitable for those wanting to start a career early with the opportunity to pursue higher education and training in the future. Students will start their new Certificate II in FSK very soon. Certificate II Business will be started after the completion of FSK in term III. ATAC will continue to deliver Certificate II courses in Business and FSK and Diploma in Business and Diploma in Leadership Management to complement the education and training of our community.

North Maclean Community Garden (NMCG) members have made more harvests of chilies which had been hampered by rain. ATAC supports our local community members to join in some projects and build them for small incomes. We have bought some bushfoods trees to provide flowers to supply nectar for our native bees and students are planning to put them in the ground. Construction of our new shed is slightly delayed due to Certification processes; however, some hands-on activities are continuing to support practical training in agricultural and technological projects. The ATAC Board greatly appreciates the effort and support of all parents and business communities supporting our students.

ATAC is a new not-for-profit senior trade college which provides individual support in small, airconditioned classrooms allowing students to learn at their own pace. Regular parental discussion and feedback provides ongoing support to develop academic success, opportunity for experience and potential apprenticeship in Year 12. Students learn to become more independent, responsible, and respectful as they would be expected to display such behavior at a workplace. Gambling Community Benefit Grant has been approved to provide some tools and machinery to complement our training and ATAC is about to build a multipurpose shed with facilities for training in construction and automotive as soon as possible. Our electrical. plumbing communications network is being upgraded to

meet the infrastructure requirements by the Council. ATAC's unique pathway and complementary VET courses provided by our RTO (#45556) adds value to education and training of our community.

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


