Principal's Message

The Covid-19 sanitization protocols have now become

mandatory with potential spread in Southeast Queensland after an unknown exposure at a high school on 29 July 2021 which is potentially widespread in the community. ATAC will continue to follow the advice of the Queensland Health and ISQ directions as contact tracing continues. Our staff, students and parents/guardians will be kept fully informed. Our new way of life has been dictated by Covid-19 safety. Several schools are expected to be seriously affected in the next few days and/or weeks.

The third term began with two new enrolments and prospect for further growth. ATAC provides opportunities for students to attend TAFE to do their career trade, Cert. II FSK, Cert. II Business and their Year 12 certificate (QCE). Work experience and a traineeship/apprenticeship by end of Year 12 is a great achievement for some students to start earning an early income. With improved infrastructure and additional new projects, we plan to engage students into automotive and construction areas alongside the agricultural projects we have developed.

Our multipurpose shed planning is ongoing with gradual progress on resolving flood management issues, currently hampering the certification. We would want to get the planning and approvals done correctly and thoroughly, regardless of additional costs. This is to avoid any disruptions. We are now planning for the 8th Bushfoods Conference on 27th November 2021 at the College.

We received some very good feedback from parents/guardians who attended the meetings to discuss the progress, engagement, and career pathways for their child. The meetings add to the support from parents and encourage students to progress in their projects and academic work with greater interest and commitment.

Our aquaponics, nursery, chicken, ducks, lizard, and bushfoods park projects are now in advanced stages. We take this opportunity to thank our energetic and enthusiastic students. Alternative pathways and engagement with projects offered here at ATAC meet the interests and needs of students who prefer more hands-on activities. Our programs make them become more independent and responsible for their learning to pursue their careers.

Information and enrolment packages can be obtained from the college for Cert. II Business, Cert. II FSK, Cert. IV & Diploma in Leadership & Management, and Diploma in Business courses for online training to external students of any age. Our RTO (#45556) is approved to provide online training for these courses.


