Year 10 students are progressing well with poultry and nursery projects while year 11 students are doing Agricultural science projects on horticulture, aquaponics, and bushfoods. They are also completing their Cert. II FSK and will start Cert. II Business in Term III.

New pumps and materials for irrigation systems have been bought to support the vertical gardens and the nursery activities. Bush foods planting and native beehives have been set up. New chooks and their supplies have been purchased for year 10 projects. Year 10 students are encouraged to start traineeships in hospitality and construction.

Thank you for the opportunity to teach your child at ATAC. At the end of term two assessments were finalised and the marking completed for reports. Thank you to all the students who worked hard to complete their assignments and were ready for their written examinations. Next term the focus will be on reading and understanding a narrative, with the Year 10 class reading a novel "Two Wolves" by Tristan Banks. The Year 11 class will be looking at texts that show an understanding of the world from one character's point of view, like the novel "48 Shades of Brown" by Nick Earls and the biographical film "Lion". 
