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Academic progress

As the term IV ends, students have been making holiday plans and finding jobs. Every student is individually supported to complete their QCE, Cert. II in FSK Cert. II in Business and a trade of their choice from TAFE. Our unique pathway provides students to obtain four certificates at the end of year 12 including their QCE.

Student projects

The chicken project has continued to produce eggs and the ducks are now ready to lay. The duck and chook fences with greater run area are complete and laying beds are being prepared for the free range hatchlings. Native lizards are being fed and taken care of by Dylan. Aquaponics veggies are taken care off by Nick and he is getting ready to introduce fish. Native plants have been planted and growing well with the recent rain. The nursery needs re-planting of vegetables, and the potted succulents are ready for transfer in the ground.

Students have been collecting and data information for the management and maintenance of their projects which compliments their agricultural curriculum. The hands-on activities are very engaging and rewarding to most of the students who love outdoor work. Additional new projects in trades and agriculture are planned for next year with the expected infrastructure improvement and funding.

Regular discussions with parents/guardians have shown that students complete their projects and academic work with greater interest and commitment.
