

The TRIPOD model of our partnerships with parents/guardians, students and ATAC promoted goodwill and understanding that enables us to nurture the friendly and less stressful education and training environment. It enables us to work closely with every child to support him/her with our flexi-model pathways. Dreams do come true

with "early careers and early incomes". ATAC provides with the semi-formal environments with less formal classroom challenges allowing all students with opportunities to utilize their talents in the way they feel comfortable and less stressful. Students also obtain their White Card and get opportunity to do their First Aid course making them eligible to start their trade careers as apprentices or to enter straight into the workforce. Our onsite trainees are also assisting in capacity building through our RTO courses. With the completion of our multi-purpose shed, we would be able to provide more hands-on skills and practical training in approved areas.
