ATAC greatly appreciates the effort by Ms. Marnie Parker of ISQ for teaching "life skills" sessions to our students on 26th October and 23rd November 2020. Australian Native flavors and complete cooking sessions with ready to go meals were prepared and enjoyed by the students and staff. Highly nutritious and adaptable Native species of plants, and animals are included in our agricultural projects to generate more interest in young people to utilize the adaptable species for unique flavours and niche markets.

Four ATAC students have been doing work experience and casual jobs and all have attended TAFE or have enrolled for Trade courses next year. Our focus is to develop work skills in students to prepare them for employment opportunities as

they progress with their academic work to complete QCE requirements. This unique pathway helps students to work at their own pace and build personal qualities, attitudes, and commitments for a lifelong career. This enables students to finish studies under less pressure compared to normal schooling and to join the workforce at an earlier age. Our hands-on, project-based and comprehensive program is suitable for those wanting to start a career early in life with the opportunity to pursue higher education and training when they are ready. Project reports are being assessed and expected to be forwarded to all students.

The heat in the last few weeks and the drought has inhibited the efforts of North Maclean Community Garden members. They had to buy water for about 500 chili plants.

ATAC has plans to build a shed and provide additional hands-on practical training specially to support learning about agricultural technologies. The Board greatly appreciates the effort and support of all parents and business communities supporting our students. 
