ATAC is a new not-for-profit senior college which provides individual support in small, conditioned classrooms allowing students to work at their own pace. Regular parental discussion & feedback provides ongoing support to develop academic success, opportunity for experience and potential apprenticeship in Year 12. Students learn to become more independent, responsible, and respectful as they would be expected to display such behavior at a workplace. Mental health support and behavior management training is provided to ATAC staff and students through a grant from the Federal Government via Hon Bert Van Manen, Local member for Forde. Gambling Community Benefit Grant has been approved to provide some tools and machinery to complement our training at ATAC.

Prof. Rod Drew was the founding chairman of ATAC in 2015. He worked closely with Dr Nand, Wanshika Rai and Dr Ian Cock to establish the College and continues to provide his knowledge and expertise to ATAC. Prof Drew graduated from Deakin University and joined DPI at Redlands, before joining Griffith University. He holds a Doctor of Science in Horticulture from University of Queensland He met Dr Nand in 1998 and was his PhD supervisor. They have since worked together as colleagues and organised 7 Bushfoods conferences. He has served as the Chairman of the Australian Society for Horticulture and the International Society for Horticultural Science (ISHS). He has also served as chair for many International Horticultural Conferences including the Horticultural Conferences held in Cairns (2002), Brisbane (2014) and in Turkey (2018). He has also been the editor of several publications, has numerous Biotechnology and Horticultural publications, and is the most well-known international scientist on papaya research. He is a very strong advocate of alleviation of "hidden" hunger (malnutrition) and increasing food security using protected high-tech facilities with low cost and efficient technologies for food production. His support for the Australian papaya industry and to ATAC is invaluable.


