Academic progress

Additional tuition in Mathematics was provided to the student as was required for his apprenticeship. ATAC's unique pathway lies in opportunities for students to do their trade career and or join in VETiS program or an apprenticeship. Every student is individually supported to complete their QCE, Cert. II in FSK Cert. II in Business and a trade of their choice from TAFE. Work experience and/or a traineeship/apprenticeship before the end of Year 12 is a great

opportunity for our students. Job ready students are placed in work environments for early career start, with some income. This strategy focusses on the career and the future of the students despite loss of an enrolment for the school if they decide to leave early.

Student projects

Our native lizard, chicken, nursery, aquaponics, ducks, and bushfoods park projects are now in advanced stages with the help of some very passionate students. Some students are involved in more specific detailed management and maintenance of their projects to contribute towards their agricultural curriculum. The various projects offered students to engage in interest-based hands-on activities. With plans to improve infrastructure we plan to offer additional new projects in trades and agriculture.

Parent/guardian engagement

We greatly thankful all those parents/guardians and businesses who engage with ATAC and provide ongoing feedback and support to our students. We continue to receive positive feedback from parents/guardians during discussions on the progress, engagement, and career pathways for their child. The meetings, emails, phone calls and regular discussions with parents/guardians encourage students complete their projects and academic work with greater interest and commitment.

ALL ABOUT ATAC

ATAC is a small new not-for-profit senior trade college which provides individual support in small, air-conditioned classrooms allowing students to learn at their own pace. Regular parental discussion and feedback provide ongoing support to develop academic success, opportunity for work experience and potential apprenticeship in Year 12 via VETiS program. Students learn to become more independent, responsible, and respectful as they would be expected to display such behavior at a workplace. Small grants such as Gambling Community Benefit Grant and Federal Government Community grants have been of great beneit to provide some tools and machinery to complement our training and mental health support. The shed with facilities for training opportunities in construction and automotive will supplement training our students to a wider range of skills. ATAC will also improve the electrical, plumbing and communications network to improve learning experiences and physical and mental health activities.

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
