English, Humanities and Agricultural Science Teacher Thank you for the opportunity to teach your child at ATAC. With the new term starting we have a lot of work to be done in a short term.
The Year 10 students have started looking at satire in comedy and how to analyze Television shows like "Summer Heights High", "Little Britain" and political cartoons. In Math, we will be learning how to read Bus/Train timetables and how to use metric measurements in everyday situations. The focus this term is on Popular Culture fads for history, so don't be surprised if your child asks about, Rubik Cubes, Skipping Ropes, Frisbees and Cassette Tapes.
The Year 12 students will be looking at the Australian character and how it has changed over the recent decades. Using examples found in Australian television, situation comedy, advertising and Australian reality television shows. Changes at ATAC include the old shed being remodeled to accommodate the Aquaponics by Nick and his team of hard-working students. It has taken great shape in the last few weeks and we hope to start moving the aquaponics equipment, the sump, grow beds and the tank. Agricultural Science Poultry project enabled students to grow day old chooks to egg laying hens. We get about 8-10 eggs per day. There are now 9 adult ducks from last year's hatchlings of a pair we had bred. Students learn the SOPs (Standard Operating Procedures), RSPCA laws and poultry husbandry for potential hobby or a small business enterprise.
