What a great feeling to be on the original proposed site at North

Maclean. Despite several delays in development approval and road access to the site, we have been informed that DTMR will undertake the service road construction, tentatively to start in March 2018. Hopefully the traffic lights at the Greenbank Road junction will become operational by late November 2018 as per our discussions last year. We do not anticipate there would be any further delays. A safe access to the site will be provided and make it much easier for all students and parents. Our refurbished Administration Building and new Fleetwood designed building, which is fully air-conditioned with necessary lighting and communications network as approved by Education Queensland is now operational for teaching-learning purposes.
