#### **Principal's Message**



Welcome to all new students, parents & guardians to the 2022 academic year. We started the term with online learning and have almost completed half of term one. Six new students have embarked on their projects and assessment tasks.

#### **Vaccinations and Masks for Schools**

Our school community is 100% vaccinated except one student who is waiting for the second dose. Thank you to all students and parents. High rates of vaccinations, accessibility and uptake of booster shots and the availability of RAT kits have made the college a safer place. Like all schools, we are waiting for the lifting of most restrictions by the Queensland government. Students, staff, and parents/visitors have followed the EQ and ISQ advice and prevented Covid-19 spread in our school community. Thank you for your great support in protecting our families and friends.

#### **ATAC Academic Plans**

Our "early career, early income and early dreams" pathways will continue with flexibility to meet classroom learning and hands-on experiences. Blended with online and face to face learning resources and assessments, students have full access to their tasks. Students can work from home and/or at school without any disruptions.

Certificate II training programs at ATAC and TAFE will continue as usual, and students will be individually supported to obtain four certificates at the end of year 12 including their QCE via alternative pathways. Training in Cert. II FSK, Cert. IV and Diploma in Leadership & Management and Diploma in Business is available to anyone interested. New Cert. II in Workplace Skills would be offered upon approval. #### Student projects

Chicken eggs and chooks were sold for a small income. We are still waiting for some ducklings for further growth of our flock. Students have been working to re-arrange the fences and security for the free-range chooks and ducks. New students are getting used to Native lizards and learning to care for them with help from Dylan. Nick is back on Aquaponics project, cleaning the tanks and grow beds despite the heavy rains. He was happy to see some Asian crops surviving heat, storm and heavy downpours. Native plants in the Bushfoods Park and the nursery are growing rapidly in the rainy season - at times struggling with the weeds. The nursery has been cleaned up for re-planting and propagation. Students have been assigned to their projects to complement their agricultural curriculum. Most students love the outdoor and hands-on activities.

#### **Community engagement**

Engagement of all parents/guardians to support our students is a priority and we greatly appreciate that partnership. Parent/guardian engagement in student activities provide a lot of encouragement for student success and you are always welcome to provide a hand.

Board of Directors have been very happy with the feedback given to them by the parents and guardians. This is very encouraging in enhancing the progress, engagement, and career development of our young people.

Congratulations to North Maclean Community Gardens (NMCG) members who have opened a big community garden at Berrinba. The members still visit ATAC to care for and harvest their chilies for some supplementary income. ATAC welcomes individuals or communities to join the community gardens and to establish any project at the college that could be of educational benefit to our students.

#### **Infrastructure Development Plans**

The earthworks have been delayed due to exceptionally bad weather and we have rescheduled the constructions with tentative dates. We are working closely with the shed company, plumbers and the council to ensure that we can have our shed ready for the Bushfoods Conference at ATAC between 26-28 May 2022.


