#### Principal's Message

#### **ATAC Academic Plans**

"Early career, early income and early dreams" are our pathways for completion of education and training. Students achieve Certificate II training programs at ATAC, TAFE courses, and Year 12 (QCE) qualifications. Training in Cert. II FSK, Cert. IV and Diploma in Leadership & Management, and Diploma in Business is open to all ages with flexible learning options. We are proving additional training to two new part-time staff to support our RTO programs. New staff will be doing Cert III Horticulture and Cert. IV in Business and Leadership & Management to provide additional support to our team in enrolling mature students in new RTO courses. New Cert. II in Workplace Skills would be offered upon approval.

#### Student projects

Some students got excited with their Bali Hut project and had shown a great team effort to cut down trees for posts. Apart from learning about Native lizards, ducks, aquaponics, and the nursery, they like to do some construction and make a traditional country style renewable hut. The old shed will form the new aquaponics site with additional space for nursery expansion. Purchase of our machinery and tools from the Gambling Fund grant is complete and they would be housed in the multipurpose building upon approval. Students are very excited to do some hands-on activities in construction, mechanical and the nursery. The weather is good to enable students to work on Native plants in the Bushfoods Park and in the nursery. With kids KRANK activity planned at ATAC on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> July from 10.00 am, the conductors Natasha and Jason Roebig will be displaying their knowledge and skills to expose young children to bee-keeping tips.

#### **Community engagement**

Community engagement in student activities provides a lot of encouragement to our students. North Maclean Community Garden (NMCG) members have shown a lot of interest to improve their engagement and continue their projects at ATAC to support their members. They want to do courses that can improve their skills in Horticulture/agriculture and our trainers will be able to provide training to many local growers. With voluntary help from Daniel Cole and Vinesh Prasad, we would like to develop our nursery to generate some income for ATAC. Members of the community, businesses and parents are most welcome to join our Board members to support our student projects.

#### **Infrastructure Development Plans**

Planning to re-schedule the preparation of the concrete pad and the shed construction upon plumbing approval is being done. The plumber and the shed company would be working closely with me to schedule the concreting and shed construction. Earthworks will begin as soon as we have received all approvals from the Council as the weather permits.

The Bushfoods Conference to be held in August has now been postponed to May 2023. By then we will be fully ready to host the National Conference on site in partnership with Australian Institute of Horticulture and Queensland Bushfoods Association. The date for the conference will be finalized at our next meeting.

#### Covid-19 – Safety & Precaution

Masks have become non-mandatory; however, students and staff are taking necessary precautions to prevent spread at the college. Students are taking RAT tests and isolating if known to be positive, RAT kits are still available at the college for students and staff. Thank you to all parents who have been able to make time to discuss their child's performance and engagement. Some students are going to TAFE while two go for apprenticeship training. Job experience and traineeship is very important, and every student should be building personal skills and making choices for their interactions with others so that they could be recommended and supported for job experiences. Some parents are assisting us in seeking employers who would provide an opportunity for job experience and/or traineeship. It is greatly appreciated by the ATAC Board.

#### English, Humanities and Agricultural Science Teacher

Assessment items for Maths, English and Health and Physical Education for year 10 had been completed. Students worked on Genetics and Evolution in Science and Agriculture Science projects. Year twelve students had been working on practice exams before completing their external Maths and English examinations. The year ten students had watched the Baz Luhrmann film "Romeo + Juliet" to understand the elements of a Shakespearian tragedy. They also watched "Gnomeo and Juliet" to compare the different ways of telling the same story. They also learned about the evolution of the species in Science and how there are many examples of Darwin's theory in our natural world.

While year ten students started attending TAFE Trade Taster program at Acacia Ridge TAFE, and year 12 continued their QCE subjects as well as their TAFE courses. Congratulations Riley for securing an apprenticeship and Nick for securing a traineeship. Dylan has completed cert II Salon assistant and he is waiting for his apprenticeship at his work experience company.

The second semester will be very busy at ATAC, with more opportunities for practical experience in construction and agriculture/horticulture. The greenhouse project will include growing lots of native plants for commercial use, and an increase in our poultry stock for animal husbandry to complement our agricultural sciences.

It is a very rewarding experience for me working with our students and seeing them grow in confidence, skills and knowledge. It is a great privilege to assist these children to plan their future career and lives. Over time here at ATAC, students are seen to be growing into a responsible, confident and an independent young person with new skills. 




